



**AGREEMENT FOR ACADEMIC AND EDUCATIONAL COOPERATION  
BETWEEN  
FACULTY OF SCIENCE, CHIANG MAI UNIVERSITY  
AND  
COLLEGE OF LIFE SCIENCE AND NANOTECHNOLOGY, HANNAM  
UNIVERSITY**

Faculty of Science, Chiang Mai University, and College of Life Science and Nanotechnology, Hannam University, in wishing to develop an academic and cultural interchange between the two institutions, agree to the following terms:

**PART I  
SCOPE**

The areas of cooperation include any undergraduate academic program offered at either institution that would be deemed feasible and desirable in terms of the fostering and development of goodwill and understanding between the two institutions. Exchanges involving graduate programs can be considered on an individual basis, but are outside the scope of this agreement.

**PART II  
TYPES OF COOPERATION**

Cooperation shall be carried out, subject to availability of funds and the approval of the Dean of Faculty of Science, Chiang Mai University and of the Dean of College of Life Science and Nanotechnology, Hannam University in the following programs:

1. Exchange of students
2. Exchange of faculty members
3. Exchange of academic materials and other information



4. Short-term academic or cultural programs

5. Other agreed academic exchanges that both institutions agree to.

The terms of the program, as well as the corresponding budgets, shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing by both institutions prior to implementation. Each school will designate a liaison officer to develop specific activities for the programs.

### **PART III**

#### **E F F E C T I V E   D A T E   A N D   L E N G T H   O F**

#### **A G R E E M E N T**

This agreement shall remain in force for a period of five years and any amendment to this agreement requires the written approval of the Presidents of both institutions. After the initial five-year period, this agreement may be renewed by mutual consent.

Either party reserves the right to terminate this agreement upon submission of a written notice to the other party six months before the desired date of termination. At the time of termination a mutually agreeable plan will be formulated to address any imbalances that may exist in the exchange of students and/or faculty.

In accordance with the Memorandum of Agreement between Faculty of Science, Chiang Mai University and College of Life Science and Nanotechnology, Hannam University, the two institutions agree to undertake a Student Exchange Program and a Faculty Exchange Program starting from the 2024 academic year.

### **PART IV**

#### **F A C U L T Y   E X C H A N G E   P R O G R A M**

1. An exchange professor, whenever possible, shall be exchanged to give lectures or conduct research upon the mutual consent of both institutions. The duration and time of this exchange will be mutually agreed upon. The qualifications of faculty involved in these exchanges will be decided upon by mutual agreement.
2. Stipends for living expenses shall be borne by the exchange professor, and / or by some outside sources.
3. Housing will be provided by the receiving institution. All other expenses, such as international airfare and living expenses will be provided by the exchange professor, and/or by some outside sources.
4. Each institution will do its best to secure possible grants to fund this project.




**PART V**  
**S T U D E N T   E X C H A N G E   P R O G R A M**

1. Each institution agrees to exchange with the other party up to two (2) full time students for one academic year. Alternatively, each institution may have four (4) students each year with two (2) each spending a single semester at each institution.
2. Exchange students are subject to the same regulations governing admission to and performance in classes as pertain to students in the receiving institution.
3. Each student will pay tuition charges to the home institution, and the students will simply exchange places.
4. Each student will pay room and board and other applicable fees to the host institution.
5. In order to insure that the health of each participant will not interfere with his or her ability to participate in the program, a certificate of his or her health will be required as the responsibility of the individual student. Proof of health insurance must be provided before arrival at the receiving institution.
6. Students participating in the exchange program will be selected by their home institution. The host institution will accept the students selected by the home institution, assuming that the selected students have been deemed academically capable and mature enough to deal with the challenges of an exchange experience.
7. Records of the student's academic performance will be sent directly to the home institution by the Liaison Officer. It will be the responsibility of the home institution to determine how many credit units the student may actually receive for courses taken at the other institution prior to his or her departure. This pre-approval will be the result of collaboration between the liaison officers of both institutions.


